This Months Flying

Landing

Our Citabria is fitted with only a few flight instruments, airspeed, altitude, and turn coordinator is all you get when you fly this plane, just the basics! You really don't even need all of these when landing, in fact, the airspeed is the only one you might need.

This month a friend wanted to fly to refresh operations flying a tail wheel plane so, we put him in the front seat of the Citabria and we put me in the back. Landings are what everyone worries about the most in a tail wheel plane so concentration on the landing maneuver was in order. We all know that a good approach usually leads to a good landing, right? Sometimes we have to adjust for the 50' obstacle that was only imaginary when we learned to fly. On final approach when the obstacle is looming in front of you followed by a runway that is a lot shorter than what you're used to, this is reality! When turning from base to final I glance at the airspeed instrument just to make sure we're at about 70 mph and no more than that. When there's someone up front doing the flying I mention this to them. Depending on the size of person in the front seat, a lot of times I can't see any of the instruments. At Dunn Airpark there is a REAL 50' obstacle when you're landing on runway 22. TREES! A stabilized approach with airspeed hovering around 65, if everything is working right, you just miss the trees and glide down to the runway flare at the red stakes (runway end markers) and land where the green stakes are. These mark the beginning of the landing portion of the runway. These are displaced 297' from the red stakes. Now, here's what happened on the flight we made. We were on final and on speed. The pilot found us to be a little low and began to pull to clear the trees. You probably know where I'm going with this, low power, slow speed and the tree is growing so, we try to clear the tree with pitch up! What's wrong with this? What is the proper correction that we should make? What is the danger in what we tried to do by pitching up to clear the trees?

I'm just curious about your thoughts on this. Talk to me.
